# Masons Island Beautiful Beach Preserved

MICA and the Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) have cooperated in the purchase of the northern end of Masons Island.

A favorite of boaters and picnickers from many parts of the bay, the natural land borders on the existing section of the island owned by MODL, which will also fall under a stewardship agreement with MICA. The roughly eight acres of environmentally sensitive land will be owned by MODL.

# MICA facilitates transfer of four more islands

MICA has successfully arranged for 16 hectares of islands to be donated by the members of the Long Island Preservation Society (LIPS) for the use and enjoyment of all.

The members of LIPS donated the Mahone Bay islands of Long, Dry, Centre and Snipe islands to the province. MICA paid the costs of the transfer and have undertaken to be the stewards of these islands.

This transfer to public ownership complements previous work the province and MICA have done to help preserve Andrews, Backmans and Covey islands.

"These four islands represent valuable pieces of Nova Scotia," said MICA Chair John Meisner. "We are pleased to see that these islands will continue to provide traditional, social and recreational

opportunities for all Nova Scotians and visitors to our beautiful province."

It is an area rich in

natural beauty with high tourist and travel appeal.

"These islands are some of our province's treasures," said LIPS member Jim Eisenhauer. "We want to make sure that they are used in a way that is fitting for their pristine beauty and rare coastal lands.


